### Dear friends

And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching. Hebrews 10: 24-25

I recall the first marathon I ever ran in Dublin very clearly. The thing that stands out for me to this very day was the stark contrast in the level of support participants received from spectators. On the one hand you had very measured support from those who were from Ireland; clapping participants and the occasional "fair play to you" was pretty much the norm from them. On the other hand, you had literally hundreds of American and Canadian supporters there to cheer on not only their family members, but anyone who was crazy enough to run 26.2 miles. They cycled up and down the course cheering on participants, whooping and constantly telling runners how well they were doing, even if they knew the reverse was actually the case! certainly know which group encouraged me most.

The writer to the Hebrews is challenging the church in their ongoing walk with the Lord as they write with the motivation of deepening their love for one another and God through their acts of service. Some christians had fallen away from meeting together, something which can happen so, so easily.

Consider how easy it is to fall away from attending church when someone says something to offend you.

Consider how easy it is to fall away from attending church if you lose a loved one and the thought of returning to worship fills you with dread.

Consider how easy it is to fall away from attending church over the summer months.

Consider how easy it is to fall away from attending church as a consequence of the pandemic and concerns surrounding being in close proximity of others for extended periods of time.

These are all very real reasons why some of us may have given up on the habit of meeting together over the past 18 months.

Now consider this....when we give up on the habit of meeting together for corporate worship, it is like removing ourselves from a hot fire and being placed on the hearth in isolation of other coals. Within a very short space of time, we have grown cold sitting on the hearth all alone while the rest of the fire remains hot and continues to benefit from being surrounded by others coals.

I wonder if that coal sitting on the hearth describes how things have been for you? Have you given up on the habit of meeting with others through hurt, loss or fear?

If that describes how you are feeling at the moment, we really do want you to know that a very warm welcome awaits you. We long to welcome you back to worship in order that we can bless and encourage one another as we whoop and cheer one another along this spiritual race we are running.

In order to help us all in our return to worship, we are holding a parish picnic in the Rectory grounds on Sunday 12th September. Everyone is welcome to attend and encouraged to bring their own picnic; we will provide all hot and cold drinks. There will be music and food, games and treasure hunts, fun for all of the family as we come to celebrate that we are one family and to encourage one another in our onward journey of faith. Those attending the 10am service are welcome to come straight over to the Rectory after the service for tea/coffee while they await the arrival of those who will be attending the 11.30am service. Or you could go home for an hour and come back for 12.30pm. Once everyone is together, we will have our big picnic and simply celebrate being one big church family whose desire is to be committed to one another and to the one we follow. Why not make a note in your diary and make it a priority to be there.

Please be assured that everyone is welcome.

Please be assured that everyone is valued, something which we try to communicate through the way in which we have managed the restrictions and how they affect our acts of public worship. The Cathedral is a much safer place to gather than any cafe, retail outlet or supermarket.

Please be assured that our desire is provide an environment within which people are encouraged and blessed.

Please be assured that without you, our church family is somehow that little bit less complete.

## GriefShare - Thursday 7th October at 7.45pm in the Cathedral Hall

Grief is something which affects all of us in different ways and at different times. Your loss could be very recent or some years ago, but the pain of loss can be just as acute. GriefShare acknowledges this and deals with all aspects of loss and at all stages.

Over the course of 13 "in person" meetings in the Cathedral Hall every other week, participants will journey with other group members and discover that there are others who have the same kind of feelings they do and who understand the hurt they feel and the loss they have experienced.

Group members often feel like their group has become a family, that they made new friends and are around people they can relate to.

The intention of each session is to help us discover hope for the future in the midst of our emptiness and loss. While things may look bleak now, you'll learn ways to restore your hope and rebuild your life. You may feel a little nervous about going to GriefShare. Those feelings go away quickly, usually during the first session.

Each of the 13 sessions consist of a welcome, refreshments, presentation via DVD and discussion. Each session is "self-contained," so you do not have to attend in sequence. You'll have the chance to talk about your experiences as it can be very healing to tell others what you are going through, to tell your story in a manner of speaking, though there's never any pressure for you to do so if you don't feel like it.

It can sometimes be difficult to move on in life when you are still dealing with the grief and emptiness that happens after a loved one dies. Through GriefShare you'll learn how to go through a healthy season of grieving, then begin transitioning to emotional and spiritual wholeness.

GriefShare is absolutely free but places are limited so please contact Geoff if you are interested in being part of it or simply to get more information.

On Sunday 3rd October we hope to have a live link with Maridi through which Bishop Moses will be sharing how God has been at work over recent years in the Diocese of Maridi.




# **Mothers' Union**


