

Dear friends

"Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Mt 11: 28

I wonder have you ever had the experience of breaking a coil spring in your car? It can be quite unnerving when you are driving and you hear clunking or knocking noises when you drive over rough or uneven ground. Coil springs are designed to make our journey smoother and more comfortable and they achieve this by being placed under relentless tension and strain throughout their "lifetime". Is it really that surprising that following a "lifetime" under stress that it ultimately results in the spring breaking under the exceptional strain or impact of hitting a pot hole or similar object in the road?

Living with stress and strain is part of every day living for most of us. Indeed it could be argued that a certain level of stress is good for us all, in moderation of course. But living life at 90mph is not something which we should be doing all the time. Using the analogy of the coil spring, if life is lived at a hectic pace all of the time, then the consequences of hitting a "bump in the road of life" could be absolutely catastrophic for not only us, but those around us. Living life in this way is not something which is encouraged, in either the Old or New Testaments. Take the example of the prophet Elijah whom we can read about in 1 Kings 18. Elijah was one of the last remaining faithful prophets in the land and in that capacity he threw down the gauntlet to a vastly superior (numerically) group of false prophets to a show down in front of the whole assembly. The stakes were high, the showdown could not have been more public and the outcome

would either see Elijah elevated in the eyes of the people or humiliated. Imagine the pressure that Elijah must have felt as all eyes were on him as he literally called down fire from heaven to establish God's rule and reign in the land once more. Elijah was victorious, the false prophets were put to the sword and word of this incident reached the ears of the king Ahab's wife, Jezebel, who was less than generous in her response. breathed murderous threats against Elijah, promising to have his life if it was the last thing she did; So Jezebel sent a messenger to Elijah to say, "May the gods deal with me, be it ever so severely, if by this time tomorrow I do not make your life like that of one of them." 1 Kings 19: 2. The reaction of Elijah to this threat is interesting to say the least. Having faced down 850 false prophets in public and been victorious, faced with the threat from Jezebel, Elijah runs for his life and ultimately wants to give up; He came to a broom bush, sat down under it and prayed that he might die. "I have had enough, Lord," he said. "Take my life; I am no better than my ancestors." 1 Kings 19: 4. Elijah was just like that coil spring, journeying through life under constant stress and strain and breaking when he hit what seemed like an innocuous bump in the road of life. An angel of the Lord ministered to Elijah by bringing rest to his mind, food for his body and restoration to his soul. That is a model of how we should introduce balance into our own lives. Periods of intense pressure and strain should be punctuated with rest and restoration. And it isn't just an Old Testament principle. Jesus himself modelled for us what a balanced or blended life should resemble as periods of intense ministry were punctuated with periods of solitude and rest. His invitation to us is to follow him, not endeavouring to do things in our own strength, but walking in his footsteps as we follow his example in the power of his spirit. Following Jesus should never be understood as a sprint but rather a marathon where, like him, we adjust the pace and intensity of ministry in order that our spiritual, physical and emotional springs remain intact.

So this summer, I encourage us all to take a break and enjoy a different rhythm of ministry in order that we might run the race set before us with as much vigour and energy at the beginning as we do at the end.

Thank You Service

One of things which has really stuck with me over the past couple of years of the pandemic, has been the debt of gratitude owed to those who have served us, due to the very nature of their work. When the majority of the country was in lockdown, confined to their homes, there were many public servants who were required to continue working, often in perilous situations, in order that food was on our tables, and we were cared for. When I use the words "public servant" I'm thinking specifically of people who quite literally served the public. Public servants might include shop workers, delivery drivers, emergency responders, health care workers; anyone who served the public faithfully during the darkest days of the pandemic.

We would like to say a huge thank you to those people by hosting a special service in the Cathedral on Sunday 4th September at 4pm. This won't simply be a service for our own church family, but rather an opportunity for us to host a Diocesan wide service for anyone in the Diocese of Dromore who served us in this way. Those attending will be encouraged to wear their uniform, if indeed their role involves the wearing of one.

Everyone is encouraged to come along to this unique service as together we say thank you for all that these public servants have done for each one of us.

Confirmation Service

We are very much looking forward to welcoming Bishop David to the Cathedral on Sunday 18th September at 4pm for our Service of Confirmation. 8 young people from the Cathedral, along with 3 adults, will be confirmed in the Christian faith that day. This will be a significant day for each one them and I would encourage us to come along and support them as they take hold of the faith which was declared on their behalf at their baptism by parents and God parents. Refreshments will be served in the Rectory garden following the service.

Starfish Ukraine - Support for Refugees from Ukraine

Starfish Ukraine originated from a group of individuals, mainly from Northern Ireland, who have been involved in helping churches in Ukraine for around 20 years. Their aim is to place refugees in safe, sustainable, and supportive homes in Northern Ireland. The Select Vestry have agreed to host an information evening at 8pm on Monday 8th August in the Cathedral Hall at which a member of Starfish Ukraine will provide us with information regarding their work and how we might get involved in supporting it. Support can take many forms, so please don't be put off by thinking that by coming along you will be expected to offer accommodation in your home. Everyone is most welcome to come along.

Climate Change Committee

In the Cathedral, we now have a Climate Change Committee made up of members of the Select Vestry, other parishioners and the clergy.

The committee will, going forward, consider ways in which we, as a church, family can make changes to things we do to help address the climate emergency. We have already made a good start by removing single use plastic from catering and replacing it with re-usable tumblers and ceramic cups/mugs/plates.

Meetings will all organisations, volunteers and staff members will take place in late August to explain and discuss ideas for each group and context.


