Dear friends

One of the lovely illustrations we were introduced to in the Grace Course was that of the change which takes place in the life cycle of a butterfly as it is transformed from a caterpillar which crawls along the ground into a beautiful butterfly which floats from plant to plant with wings which carry it graciously on it's journey. But yet the presenter observed one day a butterfly which was crawling along the ground following a rain shower which had wet it's wings. The presenter continued that, "what strikes me as strange is that this butterfly that was made to fly was crawling slowly along ground, acting in fact exactly like a the caterpillar." Many of us in our Christian walk can behave exactly like that butterfly with wet wings, either failing to realise that we are created to "fly" in a spiritual sense or we allow the things of this world to weigh heavy on us forcing us to "crawl" spiritually rather than fly as God intended.

We are introduced to a scene full of butterflies with wet wings in Acts chapter 2, as the disciples watch, wait and pray for the coming of the Holy Spirit; they numbered around 120 believers. For some of these believers, they had failed Jesus spectacularly, just as Peter had in denying Jesus 3 times. For others, they had failed to fully embrace the truth of the resurrection until they had encountered the risen Lord for themselves, just as John. Mary Magdalene and Thomas had demonstrated in John's own account of the resurrection. But all that was to change dramatically with the coming in power of the Holy Spirit. Luke records in his account that they were "filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them" Acts 2: 4.

Luke continues to explain that Jerusalem was filled with "God-fearing Jews from every nation under heaven" and that they were able to understand what was being said as "each one heard them speaking in his own language."

The caterpillars had become butterflies; the butterflies with wet wings had taken flight and were now floating and flying as intended by the one who created them. And all the crowd can ask is *"What does this mean?"* Acts 2: 12.

In response, Peter takes flight in the most spectacular fashion as he stood up and addressed the crowd, delivering a clear explanation of what had happened and what was happening. Peter is no longer crawling along the ground with damp wings but has taken flight with the wind of the Spirit lifting him and enabling him to fly boldly and graciously with his words piercing the hearts of the crowd. About 3000 were added to their number that day and the believers devoted themselves to God and one another.

We celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost Sunday each year. Such is the importance of the Spirit of Pentecost that we are required to read, at all main services, the whole account of that first experience of the coming of the Holy Spirit. But we should do more than read and remember the coming of the Holy Spirit. We should invite more and more of that Pentecost Spirit to be at work in our church and in our lives day by day.

That image of a beautiful butterfly crawling along the ground with wet wings is not an attractive one. Similarly, the reality of Christians crawling in a spiritual sense rather than flying with the Holy Spirit is a heartbreaking one. Yet it can happen so easily to each one of us as we come to Jesus but fail to live as a new creation in Christ as we allow old ways and habits to cling to us and hold us back. It can happen so easily as we allow the concerns of this world to weigh heavily on our hearts and pull us down.

Pentecost this year falls on Sunday 28th May. As we approach that day, let us not view this as just another act of worship, but rather as an opportunity for us all to embrace once more the beauty of God's Holy Spirit as we open our hearts and lives to receive Him more fully. Let us open our metaphorical wings and allow the Holy Spirit to dry them off and allow us to fly once more, just as God intended.



Sunday Morning Refreshments


Could you spare an hour 3 or 4 times a year?
