Dear friends,

"And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another advocate to help you and be with you forever—the Spirit of truth. The world cannot accept him, because it neither sees him nor knows him. But you know him, for he lives with you and will be in you." John 14: 16-17

I wonder what you would say to someone, or give to someone, you weren't going to see again for a very long time? Perhaps your words would be a reminder to them of the depth of love you have for them. Or perhaps your actions would demonstrate something which words simply fail to do. Or perhaps you would give them something which would be a constant reminder to them that they are never alone, no matter how much future circumstances might suggest otherwise.

Jesus is in the upper room with his disciples, the 11 who have journeyed with him over a 3 year period, experiencing the highs and lows of ministry (Judas Iscariot has left their company at this stage in the narrative). The end of that earthly journey together is in sight, something which Jesus has shared openly with his disciples on a number of occasions in preparation for the journey beyond the cross. But rather than just speaking words of comfort over them as they face life without him being physically present with them, Jesus makes the most generous promise. He doesn't promise to give them something to remind them of him if they ever face a low ebb in their journey. Rather, he promises to give them someone who, in his own words, will "be with you forever".

That promise was fulfilled in the most dramatic way when the Holy Spirit came in power at Pentecost, the Spirit who *"lives with you and will be in you."* The journey was never easy for any of those early followers of Jesus, but it was always a journey of presence as God made himself real for them through the indwelling Holy Spirit.

It was a significant change in life for those early disciples, but a change which was made all the easier for them as they embraced more of, and enjoyed the presence of, God with them each step of each day, just as Jesus had promised.

Some of us are facing huge changes in our lives also. For some, it may be contemplating the first day at school for a child whom you have held so close to you over their early years. For some, it may be the change of moving from one school to another and the challenge of forming new friendships and embracing new methods of learning. For others, it may mean leaving home for the very first time. Others may be facing life without someone it seems has always been there, but is no longer with us. Others might be facing full-time employment for the very first time or the change which growing older brings as perhaps mobility, or failing health, becomes more of an issue than it has been up to this point. This list of change is by no means exhaustive but rather gives us a sense of how much change we can face in life at different stages of the journey. Often the thought of change can be quite paralysing and terrifying for many of us, just as it probably was for those early disciples. But when we are able to lift our eyes from the immediacy of the next step to contemplate the presence of God through his Holy Spirit with us each step of the journey ahead, it is liberating both for us and indeed for those around us. And that freedom is experienced by both the parent who is able to let go and the child who takes faltering steps into a new sphere of life. That freedom is experienced by those who are able to see how green the grass is and how blue the sky is in spite of failing health or growing immobility. That freedom is there for you and for me the more fully our eyes are opened to the presence of God with us. I pray that whatever changes come in this next season for each of us, that we might know more and more of the promise of Jesus to be with us forever.

Combined Church Service


Following requests from a number of parishioners, it has been decided to have a combined act of worship on a monthly basis for a 6 month trial period, beginning on 24th September.


