

"Then Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert to be tempted by the devil." Matthew 4:1

I wonder what the most difficult journey is which you have had to make?

It may have been a physical journey which filled you with anxiety or fear.

It may have been an emotional journey through an illness or the loss of a loved one.

Or it may have been a spiritual journey as you wrestled with faith in the middle of one of life's storms.

Journeys are very much part of each and every one of our lives, whether we recognise that or not. And each and every journey has a beginning, a middle and an end.

At the beginning of Jesus' journey into the wilderness, he was prepared through the presence of the Holy Spirit. As the Holy Spirit led Jesus into the wilderness, it is reasonable for us to assume that he remained with him throughout that wilderness journey, and indeed beyond. Those of us who have received Jesus and embrace him as our Saviour and our Lord can count on the presence of the same Holy Spirit. What comfort that brings to know that no matter how dark the journey before us might seem that the light of God's Spirit goes before us to lighten our darkness.

Secondly, in the middle of the journey we can often experience trials and times of challenge which might cause us to consider giving up. Jesus knows what those times of trial and temptation are like as he experienced them in a very real way as satan himself tempted him when he was at his most vulnerable.

Forty days of fasting brought Jesus to a point where the bible says he was hungry; it was then that Jesus was tempted. Isn't it always the way that when we too are at our most vulnerable that satan will endeavour to trip us up and draw us away from the path which God has laid before us? Trials and challenges are part of life for all of us and followers of Jesus are no exception to the rule. We can expect that trials, temptations and challenges will meet us along the road before us. It is through perseverance and persistence in those challenging times that our faith is refined and grows stronger. Paul, in his letter to the church in Rome, wrote the following: "we also glory in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; perseverance, character; and character, hope." Romans 5: 3-4.

And finally, the end of the journey. For Jesus, the end of the journey in the wilderness was just the beginning of another journey which would see him reach the place of the cross. In a sense the journey in the wilderness was preparation for Jesus, preparation for the most important journey of his earthly ministry. As he resisted temptation in the power of God's Holy Spirit, satan departed from him and so his onward journey began.

The same can be very true for each one of us. Having received God's Holy Spirit, we can resist temptation, remain steadfast in our faith and grow in godliness

During this season of Lent, "all Christians might take to heart the call to repentance and the assurance of forgiveness proclaimed in the gospel, and so grow in faith and devotion to our Lord. I invite you, therefore, in the name of the Lord to observe a holy Lent, by self-examination and repentance,; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's holy word." BCP p338.

Lent begins with a service of contemplation and reflection in the Cathedral on Wednesday 14th February at 7.30pm, with services at the same time each Wednesday evening until Holy Week. Each evening from Wednesday 21st February onwards, each midweek service will be followed by a meeting in the Rectory at 8.15pm where those who gather will study a course entitled "The Unanswered Prayer Course." Each study will include watching a clip from a DVD, discussion and prayer. This will offer each of us a fantastic opportunity to go a little deeper with God and one another during this most holy of seasons. Everyone is most welcome to attend.

### **Revision of General Vestry List**

Each Parish in the Church of Ireland is required to maintain a Register of Vestry Members. Inclusion on this register entitles you to stand for election to serve on the Select Vestry and to exercise your right to vote at our Annual General Vestry meeting. A review of this register must take place in February of each year, with this year's review meeting is taking place at 7.30pm on Monday 19th February 2024, in the Clayton Memorial Hall.

If your name does not already appear on the register and you would like to have it added, you would need to contact the Church Office on 028 9269 3968 or <a href="mailto:dromorecathedral@outlook.com">dromorecathedral@outlook.com</a> and request a form of declaration which needs to be completed and returned to the Church Office or the Rectory before the review meeting takes place. Those who wish to have their name added to the register have to be 18 years old or above and have supported the Church financially in a recordable manner in the year previous to the review meeting. Recordable financial support is by means of FWO envelopes, Standing Orders, online Bank Transfer or a one off donation where the donation is done in such a manner that a receipt could be provided. Loose offerings on the collection plate do not qualify as recordable giving as there is no way of determining the identity of the giver.

The register must be open for one calendar month prior to the review meeting taking place so will be open and available for inspection in the Church Office from Friday 19th January.

### **Jar of Grace**

One of the things we are encouraging our Church family to engage in during the season of Lent this year is prayer and giving through the Jar of Grace.

### What is the Jar of Grace?

It is simply a glass jar which you place on your meal table throughout the season of Lent. You could get a jar yourself by simply using an empty jam jar and placing a sticky label on it with the words "Jar of Grace" written on it. Or, if you are out for a walk in the town on your daily form of exercise, you could call into the Church Office where a supply will be available in the foyer for collection.

#### How does it work?

It is very simple. At each meal time throughout Lent, we are asking every person at every meal time to take a moment to place a coin/coins in the jar and offer a prayer of thanksgiving for the food and for the projects we will be supporting through your giving. The prayer can be spoken or silent; all of our prayers are acceptable in God's sight through Jesus. On Easter Sunday we would encourage everyone to bring their Jars of Grace to Church and we will receive them and ask God's blessing on them.

This year, the proceeds of the Jar of Grace will be supporting the ongoing work of the Diocese of Maridi as they continue to support young boys and girls through the brick project. The brick project ensures that orphans are educated, fed and have somewhere to sleep as they in turn make bricks to enable their country to be re-built following decades of bloody conflict and war.

### Praise, Prayer & Testimony

Our next Praise, Prayer & Testimony service will be at 6pm on Sunday 4th February 2024. Carolyn Jackson will be sharing something of her story of faith and how God has been at work in her life.

Carolyn is married to Jonny and they have 3 children. Carolyn is part of the Prayer Ministry Team and has a passion for helping followers of Jesus to grow in their faith, something which is evidenced through her involvement in co-leading courses like the Prayer Course in the Cathedral.

### The Unanswered Prayer Course

Why not consider taking up something this Lent, as well as giving something up? Perhaps you've wondered why our prayers sometimes don't appear to be answered. If that is the case, then maybe this course is the thing you've been looking for.

This is an opportunity for the church family to consider some of the most painful and challenging questions which we all may find ourselves asking at some stage in our lives.

Meetings will begin on Wednesday 21st February and continue each subsequent Wednesday evening for 5 sessions in total examining different aspects of unanswered prayer. Each evening will begin at around 8.15pm in the Rectory, immediately after the midweek Lenten service, and will last around 60-75 minutes. As has been our practice, no one will be asked to read, pray or even speak and everyone is really welcome to attend.

The following is something of a summary of what we will be examining each week, with each session consisting of an introduction, video presentation and discussion....

### 1 God on mute: Engaging the silence (21st February)

Kicking off the course with an honest look at the big questions we all ask when confronted with suffering.

### 2 Maundy Thursday: How? (28th February)

In this session we address questions of the heart: seeking to find purpose in pain and strategies for dealing with disappointment.

### 3 Good Friday: Why? (6th March)

Why aren't my prayers working? In this session we wrestle with some of the most difficult intellectual questions: why does an all-loving, allknowing, all-powerful God allow suffering?

### 4 Holy Saturday: Where? (13th March)

Where is God when heaven is silent? This session explores the questions we ask when we find ourselves trapped between the pain of Good Friday and the miracles of Easter Sunday.

### 5 Easter Sunday: When? (20th March)

When will my prayers be answered? Celebrating the hope we have in the resurrection of Jesus and anticipating the day when all of our prayers will find their answer in His return.

Our speaker on Wed 21st February will be Jillian McMinn who will demonstrate her crafts whilst talking about her faith journey. Looking forward to seeing you all.




### A LOOK AT LIFE WITH THE RECYCLED TEENAGER - Perseverance


