Dear friends

*.... some of our women amazed us. They went to the tomb early this morning but didn't find his body. Luke 24: 22-23*

I wonder how you cope with disappointment and the inevitable challenges which life can present from time to time? For some of us it takes a trip to the shops to lift our spirits. But if we are really honest with ourselves, how long does that new item of clothing lift our mood for? My own experience has been that just as quickly as the "fix" lifts our mood, so it passes just as quickly.

For others, it is the hope of a long-awaited holiday which we trust will take our blues away. As I write these notes I could tell you precisely the number of days to our next break in the sun. These breaks mean the world to me as they are the only time when I can truly get away from things. But can I tell you from experience that the holiday feeling passes for me before we even arrive back in Ireland!

Holidays, clothes, exercise and friends, amongst other things, all play their part in helping us deal with disappointment, hurt and pain. But none of these actually "fix" the core root of the problem which is the sense that we have lost control of the circumstances within which we find ourselves.

I want to suggest to you that Cleopas and his companion were overcome and overwhelmed by the sense that their circumstances were spiralling out of control. They were walking away from Jerusalem on their way to Emmaus, a distance of some 7 miles. It was resurrection

day and they had undoubtedly heard the reports from the women who had discovered the empty tomb that very morning. Jesus walked along with them but we are told that they were prevented from recognising him, probably due to the overwhelming sense of loss and grief they were experiencing. In their conversation with the risen Jesus they speak of what has happened and how their hopes have been shattered. These are followers of Jesus who have perhaps given up everything to follow Jesus. These are followers of Jesus who have recalibrated their worldview with Jesus at the centre. These are followers of Jesus who have built their lives upon the foundation that is Jesus himself rather than the things which the world has to offer. With the cruel death of Jesus on the cross, I have no doubt that they felt completely and utterly overwhelmed. I have no doubt that they felt that their world was spiralling out of control. I have no doubt at all that they felt shaken to the very core of their being as everything which they had pinned their lives and hopes on seemed to have been so cruelly stripped away.

As their journey was coming to an apparent end, Jesus acted as if he were going farther but they persuaded him to join them. It was in the breaking of bread with Cleopas and his companion that their world was turned upside down as suddenly they saw things through a kingdom lens.

If we as followers of Jesus remain at the cross, we too are left with the inevitable feeling that things are completely out of control. The journey to the empty tomb is essential for each and every one of us as it helps us to recalibrate our own thinking and understanding of what happened at the cross. Standing at the empty tomb we can now understand that the cross is not about the defeat and death of Jesus, but rather the defeat and death of sin. We can now understand that rather than having lost control of events at, and leading up to, the cross, Jesus was in absolute control of every single aspect of what was unfolding. And the same is true for the challenges and disappointments which we may face in life. We may well feel that things are out of control. But the empty tomb reminds us that God is in complete control of every seemingly impossible situation.

I encourage each one of us to gather for worship at our combined act of worship this coming Easter as we celebrate the truth that He is risen and remind ourselves that He is in control.

# Light the Beacons: St Patrick's Day Celebrations 2024

'Light the Beacons' is the theme for this year's annual St Patrick's Day festival which will focus on praying for a rekindling of the fire of faith that Patrick lit in Ireland almost 1600 years ago.

The diocesan celebrations will take place on Saturday 16th



March and include special prayer services in parishes on Sunday 17th March.

Our guest preacher at the Festival Service at 11.45am in Down Cathedral is Rt Revd Dr Jill Duff, Bishop of Lancaster.

Bishop David says: "Bishop Jill's scholarly and yet deeply spiritual insights into the lives of the saints including St Patrick (see her book *Lighting the Beacons: Kindling the Flame of Faith in our Hearts*). means she is the ideal person to encourage us to pray as a diocese for rekindling of the fire of faith that Patrick lit in Ireland almost 1600 years ago.

"In 433AD in defiance of the pagan king, Laoise, Patrick lit a Paschal fire to celebrate Easter. It was said that if that Paschal fire was not put out on that day it would never be extinguished. Almost 1600 years later the fire of the gospel has not been put out but needs fanned into flame in Ireland again."

Bishop David will light a symbolic fire at the end of the Festival Service and a representative from each church in the diocese will take a torch and a container of concentrated paraffin oil back to their parish.

On the evening of 17th March, St Patrick's Day, every church large and small, will hold a special service of prayer for revival. With beacons lit, we'll be asking God to light the fire of the gospel in Ireland and in that local church context once again.

## Holy Week Services

Holy Week is a very special season in the Christian year as we endeavour to retrace the footsteps of Jesus towards the cross and all that that journey involved. As a church, we have always sought to do that in as meaningful and inclusive a way as we possibly can, and this year will be no different.

Each weekday evening, there will be a reflective service in the Cathedral at 8pm, with the exception of Thursday evening when the service will be at 8.30pm. We trust that these services will provide us with a safe space to reflect on the journey of Jesus as we engage in a more meaningful way on our own journey with Him.

Additionally, we will be having an Agape meal on the Thursday evening at 6.30pm in the Cathedral Hall, an occasion for the whole family to gather for a family meal and Holy Communion.

And finally, on Good Friday morning there will be one further opportunity to worship during this week of weeks.

At 7am in the morning, we would encourage folks to gather for a service of readings and reflections around the cross. This has proved to be a very popular and poignant service for those who have attended in the past.

Please do make a very special effort to attend some, or indeed all, of these services which we are providing for all ages during this very special week.

## Evening of prayer for Ireland with symbolic lighting of Beacon

Our evening Epilogue service on Sunday 17th March at 6pm will include prayers for an outpouring of God's Holy Spirit and the lighting of a beacon to symbolize the Paschal fire lit by St Patrick in defiance of a pagan king in 433AD. Our land desperately needs a fresh outpouring of God's Holy Spirit, as in the time of Patrick. Please do join us in praying "Come Holy Spirit."


## **New Pew Cushions**



## Easter General Vestry Meeting

The Annual Easter General Vestry meeting will be held on Thursday 11th April at 8.00pm in the Cathedral Hall. Everyone is warmly and sincerely invited to attend but only those who are registered General Vestry members will be eligible to vote or indeed stand for election to office on the Select Vestry.

The Annual Easter Vestry Meeting includes an address from the Rector focusing on highlights from the past year. In addition, the audited Parish Accounts for the calendar year 2023 will be presented by the Honorary Treasurer for adoption. The Select Vestry have decided once more, in the interests of genuine transparency and to encourage deeper engagement, the audited accounts will be made available upon request to anyone who would like to have a copy in advance of the meeting. These accounts will be clearly marked as having been audited but not adopted and will be available from early April.

The business of the Annual Easter Vestry meeting also includes the appointment of a Rector's Churchwarden and Glebewarden and the election of a People's Churchwarden, Glebewarden and 12 members of the Select Vestry to serve the Church throughout the following year. When considering who to elect to serve in this way, parishioners should do so prayerfully and with due diligence as mission and ministry are enabled through the careful, prayerful allocation of parishioner's finances.

Pastoral care and all things regarding the spiritual development of all ages remains the responsibility of the clergy with the support of the Select Vestry.


