Dear friends

The big question of when the General Election would be has been answered - the country goes to the polls on the 4th July.

But for some of us this now raises a couple of other questions to consider...

Why bother voting at all? And if I do decide to vote, who should I vote for?

I hope to help us arrive at a biblically informed answer to the foregoing questions as we prepare for what our Prime Minister has referenced as being a pivotal moment in our history. 'Now is the moment for Britain to choose its future. This election will take place at a time when the world is more dangerous than at any time since the Cold War.' Rishi Sunsak, 10 Downing Street, 22nd May 2024.

So firstly, in response to the attitudes of those I would call apathetic at best, I say grasp the opportunity to exercise your democratic right and vote on the 4th of July. I often hear folks moan about what difference it will make to vote for one party or another. To those who would share that outlook I would say focus on the fact that we live in a free country where our forefathers have literally fought for our freedom and laid down their lives for the right for us to be able to vote. I would argue that it would be much, much worse to live in a land where we had no such rights. Imagine what it would be like to live in a world where the weak are down trodden and the poor have no voice. Regardless of our position in our society, each and every adult has the right to vote in the United Kingdom, so use it!

Scripture encourages us to pray for those in authority, "I urge, then, first of all, that

petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people— for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness." 1 Timothy 2: 1-2. Paul is acknowledging that for the peaceful ordering of society, there must be those who are set in authority over us and that we should hold them in prayer. By exercising your right to vote, you are contributing to the process of electing leaders who have the qualities and characteristics which are essential for them to govern wisely for the common good.

Secondly, in seeking to answer the second question of who to vote for, I'm not going to point you to a candidate or a political party; that is for your own discernment. But rather I am going to give you some pointers which I trust will enable you to focus on the character and qualities of the candidate you would wish to serve you and your community.

Firstly, look for integrity in your elected leader. The bible tells us that, *"The Lord detests lying lips, but he delights in people who are trustwor-thy." Proverbs 16: 22* Integrity, or rather a lack of it, is something which disappoints us and causes deep hurt when we consider some of the established failings of those in high office in very recent years. However, when we find ourselves in the presence of someone who displays true integrity, they stand tall in the presence of their peers and value that which is right, not just expedient. Think of someone known to you who has integrity. Consider how they are respected above others around them. Now consider someone with the same measure of integrity leading in the political sphere of our lives. Vote for a leader who speaks the truth in love and values the importance of being honest and transparent before those whom they are elected to serve.

But what good is the character of the person if they don't have competence in equal measure? Competence is not only possessing the ability to conceive of a strategy to deal with a very real issue. But also having the resolve, focus and determination to deliver what has been promised. Competence in our elected leaders is something which is crucial, otherwise we find ourselves being led by those, who whilst well-intentioned, can't address real issues and deal with issues of genuine concern within our communities.

So that is my guidance in preparation for our forthcoming General Election. Choose those who possess an equal measure of Godly character and competence. And pray for those elected, just as Paul urged young Timothy to do so. Geoff

Everyone is most welcome to attend the forthcoming meeting, to join in some fellowship, and to engage in a lively discussion about the Celts.


Car Wash and Car Boot Sale

A very sincere word of thanks to those who attended, enabled or contributed in any way to either of the above events.

The Car Wash raised £400 for church funds and will enable mission and ministry which would not otherwise have been possible. We can never under-estimate just how important occasions like this are in terms of fellowship, but also in terms of raising much needed funds.

The Car Boot Sale was the first fundraiser for the team which will be travelling to Maridi in the autumn of this year, departing on Sunday 27th October and returning on Thursday 7th November. This Diocesan team consists of the Rector, Jeremy Bowden, Ian Cardy and Nick Davies. Earlier this year, the opportunity to serve as part of this team was widely advertised on the Diocesan website and through CMS Ireland. Jeremy, Ian and Nick were the folks who put their hands up and said "Here am I Lord, send me." The cost of the trip is considerable (£3250 per person) with each member being personally responsible for 50% of the cost with the other 50% being raised through team fundraising. This first fundraiser raised the fantastic amount of £905.92. Thank you to everyone who got behind this and contributed in any way they could. Not all of us are able, or feel called , to travel to Maridi, but all of us can support those who do. Future fundraisers include a "Lap of the Lough" on Saturday 14th September when the Rector will cycle around Lough Neagh, a distance of around 110 miles. Later in September there will be a Talent Night in the Cathedral Hall with an auction of talents as part of the evening; more details to follow.
