Dear friends

The apostles gathered around Jesus and reported to him all they had done and taught. Then, because so many people were coming and going that they did not even have a chance to eat, he said to them, "Come with me by yourselves to a quiet place and get some rest." Mark 6: 31-32

Imagine a season of work which is so busy that you don't even have time to eat and then you will understand the setting which the apostles find themselves in. They have just returned from a time of mission and ministry whereby they are confronting the realms of darkness. In these places of conflict we not only confront brokenness and bring healing as we engage in a ministry of the spirit, but there is a physical cost for those who find themselves close to the point of exhaustion. Their reputation has spread and everyone is demanding the attention of the apostles to the point that they don't have any time for themselves, let alone those around them.

Jesus recognises the danger of this model of ministry without rest. Jesus cares about the consequences of working relentlessly without periods of rest to recharge us in body, mind and spirit. And so he invites the apostles to join him as he seeks out a place of solitude where they can be restored.

This restoration is essential if their ministry is to be both effective and sustained over the length of their lifetimes. And the same is true of us today. Ministry cannot be maintained over a prolonged period of time without regular rest and relaxation. The summer time offers us all an opportunity for a different rhythm of ministry as we all "stand down" from the busyness of kingdom ministry, whether that be leaders in children's or senior's ministry. May we all seize the opportunities which the summer presents us with to find a quiet place, get some rest and encounter Jesus.

Have a really restful and restorative summer time.

Car Boot Sale for Maridi Team - Saturday 21st September

By now I'm sure that you are all aware that a team from our Parish are travelling to our link Diocese of Maridi in South Sudan in late October/early November of this year. Not everyone can support Maridi in this way, but everyone can support those going by getting behind some or all of the fundraisers which will be taking place to help raise 50% of the team costs (the team are personally responsible for the remaining 50% of the costs of the trip).

One of the fundraisers which the team are organizing is a Car Boot Sale on Saturday 21st September from 10am to 12.30pm in the Cathedral Hall car park. Cars are £10 with cars and trailers costing £20. Entry is £2 which will include a cup of tea or coffee and a biscuit. If you don't wish to bring a car, perhaps you might consider having a bit of a clear out and giving any unwanted but clean/serviceable items to the team to sell on the day as they will also have a table with all proceeds going to the trip (contact Geoff on 07808 844637 for more details). Please do support the team in whatever way you can as we seek to deepen our links with our brothers and sisters in Maridi.

Talent Show and Auction of Talents

Saturday 28th September is a date which I would encourage you to mark in diary as "not to be missed". That evening in the Cathedral Hall at 7.30pm we will have an evening where folks will be able to display their talent, whatever that might be (within reason!) for all to see. If you are a child learning to play the piano, then we love to hear you play that evening. If you are an adult with a gift for reciting poetry, then we would love to hear you that evening. If you have a gift for singing or dancing, then we would love it if you would perform for us that evening. Everyone is welcome to perform, whether from within the Church family or indeed the wider community. Tickets will be priced at the bargain price of £10 with children at £5. During the course of the evening, there will also be an auction of talents. You could pick up a car valet, a hair cut, a night away in a caravan or have a meal for 2 in a restaurant and much, much more. All proceeds from this evening will go to support the team travelling to Maridi in October of this year. Tickets available from Jill in the Church Office.

What is Confirmation?

When we confirm something we say yes. At confirmation we say yes to Jesus' call to follow him on our journey through life. We confirm our faith in him. Parents and godparents will usually have said yes for us when we were babies and were unable to speak for ourselves at baptism, but confirmation gives us the chance to say yes.

If you would like to say yes to Jesus through confirmation, there will be an opportunity to do so on the afternoon of Sunday 17th November 2024 in the Cathedral. As a rule of thumb, candidates need to be of an age that they understand clearly what it is they are saying yes to, generally from age 14 and above, though there are individuals who clearly understand at a younger age. Confirmation isn't just limited to young people, as adults who have not yet been confirmed can choose to be confirmed in their faith, often at a much later stage in life.

If you would like to find out more about what is involved in being prepared for confirmation this November and whether it is right for you, then please do let Geoff know in order that adequate time is set aside for preparation for what should be a very special service in which you say to the world that you are choosing to follow Jesus.

Lap of the Lough - Saturday 14th September

This is a fundraiser for the team which will be travelling to Maridi in the autumn of this year, departing on Sunday 27th October and returning on Thursday 7th November. The Rector will cycle around Lough Neagh, a distance of around 110 miles.

If you would like to sponsor him, then simply place your name on the list in any of the porches or in the Church Office. If you are a UK taxpayer, by placing your address and postcode on the list and ticking the relevant box, we can reclaim tax from HMRC which you have already paid, at no additional cost to yourself.

If you would like to see the Rector off, he will be leaving the Clayton Hall car park at 9am on Saturday 14th September. More importantly for him though, he will be returning (DV) at around 6pm the same day, hopefully!

The book that the group are reading in advance of this meeting is-

Caravaggio - A Life Sacred and Profane by Andrew Graham-Dixon

Michelangelo Merisi da Caravaggio was born in Milan in 1571 and died of a fever while on a journey from Naples to Rome in July 1610.

This book documents the turbulent life and the work of someone whose name would sit, with some considerable ease, on any list the greatest artists who have ever lived.

Two Caravaggio masterpieces will, effectively, be on our Dromore doorstep during the summer of 2024. Both are on temporary display at the Ulster Museum, Belfast until 1 September 2024.

The Supper at Emmaus (1601) - on loan from The National Gallery, London The Taking of Christ (1602) - on loan from The Irish National Gallery, Dublin

The two masterpieces were painted for the same Roman patron and adorned the walls of a family palace. They have rarely been seen together since the early 17th century.

Over the summer period do take an opportunity to go and view what are two truly great works of art.

All are most welcome to join with the History Reading Group in late August to discuss the brief life and the outstanding work of the artistic genius that was Michelangelo Merisi da Caravaggio.

He was readying the beach for the tourists, who'd probably not know that he went out every morning to repeat this task. I spoke no Portuguese and he had no English but nevertheless we were able to communicate, that he thought I was mad to be paddling in the sea at 7.30am and I impressed upon him, that raking the beach of seaweed for it to re-establish itself on the next tide was even worse lunacy.

Still, I was impressed with his tenacity and just like the waves that repeatedly wash in and out along the shore, he came back day after day to perform what seemed to be a boring and mundane task.

This is our lives. We get up, we go out, we come back in again and go to bed. All the time spent on a daily basis in between usually becomes familiar and routine. However it is in those repetitive tasks that we serve others. Think what our lives would be like if the <u>people</u> we depended on, just didn't show.

Just the act of getting up in the morning may be difficult enough but its worth it. And what a privilege it is to keep repeating it.

The most important thing was to have the ShelterBox tents up on the lawn with Kerr, the ShelterBox representative, to explain how it all works.

The result is already getting urgent assistance to Gaza by providing shelter, mattresses, water filters, solar lights, kitchen sets etc. to families in desperate need. Pastoral Care

Since my institution in November 2016, pastoral care has been, and will remain, a number one priority. Since that time, I have put in place a system of visitation which, in more recent years, was largely overseen by the Rev Trevor McKeown. Consequently, those who are over 80, housebound or have a particular need have been visited around 5-6 times a year, or indeed more regularly if particular needs were identified. With the retirement of Trevor at the end of June, some of you may be wondering how this will impact visitation. I wish to reassure you that these visits will continue to be carried out, though perhaps not quite as frequently as previously; I would hope in the short term to be able to carry out these visits myself until such times as a suitably skilled and called individual is identified to assist with this important ministry. Should you become aware of someone who would benefit from a pastoral visit, please do let me know and I will endeavour to call as soon as practicable.

I will be on holiday from Tuesday 9th July to Tuesday 23rd July inclusive. Should you become aware of a pastoral emergency during this period please contact either of our Churchwardens (Alan Turkington on 07597 147294 or Andrew McNeill on 07428 433349) and they will arrange for someone to support you, whatever the need might be. **Geoff**


