The rapid growth of singleuse plastics has made this crisis worse. It's fuelling our throwaway culture, threatening people's health and making the climate emergency worse. It's a rubbish campaign is a resource produced by Tearfund to help us all consider the scale of the problem and resolve to do something about it. 

The book that the History Reading Group are reading in advance of this meeting is - The Templars - The Rise and Fall of God's Holy Warriors by Dan Jones.

The book is readily available from both high street and on line retail outlets in paperback format and at reasonable cost.

The Knights Templar were the wealthiest and most powerful of the military orders that flourished during the crusading era. Dan Jones tells the story of their establishment in Jerusalem in 1119, their rise as a warrior elite and their role in global politics and finance. The history of the Knights Templar is charted until their dissolution on Friday 13th October 1307. The Knights Templar continue to influence modern culture with examples being the movie Indiana Jones and the Last Crusade, the book and movie The Da Vinci Code and the date of their dissolution influencing modern day superstitions about "Friday 13th"


Nativity Service

Death of Archdeacon Billy Neill

It is with a genuine sadness that we share news of the passing of a much-loved former Rector of Dromore Cathedral, the Ven Billy Neill.
