

Have you ever considered how important our names are? They help us to identify ourselves within our families and beyond. But they also help us to understand that when someone uses our name, that they know us to some extent.

In this encounter between Jesus and Mary Magdalene at the empty tomb on that first day of the week, Mary is the first to discover that the tomb is empty and it shakes her world completely. She has come to anoint the body of Jesus for burial and thinks that his body has been stolen. She is bewildered and traumatized by this discovery and, in trying to make sense of things, she has a conversation with Jesus, but takes him to be a gardener. It could be that her trauma blinds her to the true identify of Jesus at that point in time. The past week for Mary Magdalene and the followers of Jesus have been packed with drama and emotion; from the triumphant entry into Jerusalem to the cruel death of the one they loved, worshipped and devoted their lives to, it has been a real roller coaster of emotions.

And now here at the tomb, Jesus acknowledges much more than her identity by calling Mary by name. He wipes away all of the fear and angst which might cripple her and in so doing enables her to be the carrier of the Good News to the other disciples.

This Easter, let us also consider that Jesus sees your trauma and pain, he knows much more about you than your name, and he wants his resurrection truth to set you free from those things which hold you captive.

# Abyss - World On The Brink - The Cuban Missile Crisis 1962 by Max Hastings (A Times History Book of the Year 2022)

This book provides a definitive account of the brief but terrifying period in 20th century history when the world stood on the very edge of a nuclear confrontation between the United States of America and the Soviet Union.

The detailed research and highly skilled pen of author, Max Hastings, charts the nail biting days during which a potentially catastrophic conflict beckoned and focuses on the roles of those directly involved -

USA - President John F Kennedy, Vice President Lyndon Johnson, General Curtis LeMay - Chief of Staff. Soviet Union - First Secretary of the Communist Party, Nikita Khrushchev and Chairman of the Presidium, Leonid Brezhnev. Cuba - Prime Minister, Fidel Castro and Minister of Defence, Raul Castro.

Everyone is most welcome to attend this meeting and join in what promises to be a very interesting and engaging discussion about that moment in 1962 when the world stared into an "Abyss".

There's a lot of talk about purpose. In fact some people think talking is their purpose. (I feel the fingers pointing back at me). It has been said that we cannot be happy and fulfilled unless we have a sense of purpose in our lives. I wonder why it is so hard to find our sense of purpose?

Many young people struggle to know what they want to do when they leave school. Get a good job, settle down, even get married and have a family because they think that's just what society expects them to do. Nothing wrong with all those aims and ambitions but will they, on their own, bring the fulfilment humans seem to crave? I have often wondered what kind of example I've set my boys where life choices are concerned and if I've guided them to seek out what is really important.

We are daily bombarded with advice about what will make us happy. New phones, faster broadband, winning that prize draw where they give you a fantastic house or the holiday of a lifetime. I'm quite sick of the phrase, 'lifechanging' being used to describe varying amounts of prize money. There is only one truly life-changing event - the experience of asking Jesus to come into your heart. That is the event that sets us back on the road to Eden and our God-given purpose.

When Geoff preached about Creation in the first chapter of The God Story, I was clearly reminded that our purpose as human beings is no different now than it has ever been. We are made to have a loving relationship with God, loving relationships with one another and to care for our planet.

Our sense of purpose is to be found right back at the beginning.




