I wonder if you can recall your first day at school? Perhaps, like me, it is too long ago to recall! So what about your first day in a new job? Or the first time you worshipped in a new church? I'm sure that if we all thought about it for long enough we could recall what it felt like to step into something new for the very first time.

September/October each year is a time of radical change for many of our children and young people. For some it involves moving to a new school, or place of further education. For some it involves moving into the workplace for the very first time. For some it involves leaving home and living independently, sometimes without any existing friendship or family support It can be daunting for many groups. causing feelings of anxiety to arise within. I heard a story this past week of a little child being taken to school following the summer break and sharing anxiously how their tummy was upset. The mummy shared with me that it made her feel sick to hear her child speak of their own anxiety.

Such feelings are not unusual amongst our children and young people, not because they are more sensitive than previous generations, but because we are now more open about our feelings rather than bottling them up as perhaps previous generations were more likely to do.

So what do we say and how do we face that sense of rising anxiety when it occurs?

Well, we can learn a huge amount from the story of Joshua. Joshua was one of those Israelites who journeyed through the wilderness with Moses every step of the way. Every step of the journey, Joshua looked to Moses as the leader of the people and his expectation was that Moses would lead the children of Israel across the Jordan and into the promised land. Imagine his shock and sense of anxiety when the Lord announced to him that as Moses was now dead, that he, Joshua, would be the one to lead them into the unknown. The first 9 verses of the book of Joshua are written in such a way as to make it very clear to Joshua that the Lord was with him, that he was God's person for this time, that nothing and no one could prevent him from achieving God's purposes and that wherever he went, the Lord would be with him. Joshua trusted God and achieved great things for the Lord. Joshua focussed on God's promises to him rather than allowing any sense of fear or anxiety to overshadow what had been spoken over him.

So how can the story of Joshua help us as we face substantial change?

Well, firstly we can rely on God's promise to be with us every step of the journey, just like Joshua. One of my favourite stories in the bible illustrates this truth so well. In Luke 24, Cleopas and his companion are journeying away from Jerusalem following the crucifixion of Jesus. Jesus walked with them, even though they were unable to recognize him. Jesus' promise to each and every child of God is to never ever leave nor forsake. I wonder how much we allow ourselves to be blinded to this glorious truth when fear takes over?

Secondly, Joshua was able to look over his shoulder and remind himself of how the Lord had been with Moses and the children of Israel throughout their difficult wilderness journey. If the Lord was with them in the past and has promised His presence for the future, why should he doubt? Similarly in our lives, we can look backwards and see those times when it was so clear that the Lord was with us and this knowledge can help us to face the future with total confidence.

Lastly, as Joshua trusted in the Lord so he was able to influence those around him as they faced an uncertain future. This was so clear in the instructions of Joshua to the people as they prepared to embark on this journey together as he told the people, "Consecrate yourselves, for tomorrow the Lord will do amazing things among you." Joshua 3: 5 In essence faith was passed from one generation to the next.

Lets encourage our children and young people as they face uncertainty in the future with a growing sense of trust in the Lord.

Property Update

Maintenance of our church buildings remains a key priority for the Select Vestry. Unless we maintain our buildings to a very high standard, we are not able to effectively fulfil the great commission of Jesus to make disciples of all nations.

As part of our ongoing commitment to maintenance, an in depth inspection of all church buildings is carried out every 5 years with key recommendations arising out of this. Following our most recent inspection in the autumn of last year, the following were identified as being in need of urgent attention....

Firstly, the plaster on the interior of the cathedral wall in the region of the memorial window. Those who sit in this general area may have noticed that there is evidence of dust and grit from time to time on the seat cushions in this area. This is due to the plaster coming away from the wall, something which is in need of urgent attention over the next few months. The Glebewardens are in the process of securing a contractor to carry out this work in the very near future. This may necessitate the pews in the immediate vicinity being inaccessible for a few weeks whilst the work is carried out.

Secondly, and of much greater concern, is the condition of the wiring in the whole of the cathedral. It has become clear to the Select Vestry that the rewiring of the cathedral must be carried out without any undue delay. A firm of conservation Architects have been engaged to oversee this work, along with Electrical and Mechanical Engineers who are in the process of drawing up tender documents. The Select Vestry have also decided that now is the time to improve the lighting in the cathedral as the current lighting clusters are not only difficult to access, posing significant health and safety concerns, but are also very poor in terms of efficiency when it comes to illuminating the space and the associated running costs. Consequently, the Select Vestry have decided that now is the time to improve the lighting as well as rewiring the building. This will mean removing the cluster pendant lights and replacing them with appropriate wall mounted up and down lighters which will better illuminate the roof as well as the floor. Whilst we don't have tender prices for this work at this stage, the projected costs for this important work are in the region of £195,000.00, inclusive of VAT. This is a very significant sum of money and the Select Vestry are convinced that elements of this work are not only essential but also extremely desirable to ensure that our beautiful is not only preserved for future generations of worshippers but also greatly enhanced through the improved lighting.

Some of us may be asking where on earth such a sum of money is going to come from, so I would now like to take some time to outline how this project will be financed and paid for.

The Select Vestry are of the view that the following breakdown of funding is how this will be achieved:

Funds available from church funds £50,000 Funds from grant bodies £50,000 Funds from fundraising activities £95,000

It is recommended by the Charities Commission that registered charities hold 6 months operating costs in reserve, so the Select Vestry will set aside approximately £60,000 to ensure we are able to comply with this obligation/recommendation.

To assist with securing funds from grant bodies, the Select Vestry have engaged the services of a consultant to assist with the submission of grant applications.

In order to raise the remaining £95,000 of the project costs, the Select Vestry have agreed that a series of fundraising activities will commence in the autumn term, as follows.....

Monthly car wash on the 1st Saturday morning of each month;

Family social evening on Friday 26th September, details on page 7;

Family sponsored cycle from Scarva tow path on Saturday 27th September;

Country comes to Town on Saturday 18th October;

Harvest Appeal on Harvest Sunday;

Big breakfast in November;

Christmas Fayre in November.

The above list is far from exclusive but hopefully gives a sense of how we intend to go about raising the necessary funds for the crucial work over the next while. In the short term we may need to revert to securing a bank loan to ensure we can meet our obligations; the shorter the term of the loan will be determined by the commitment and generosity of each one of us. Details of some of the above fundraisers are available in this magazine with further details appearing in future issues and by other means.

Harvest Appeal

Each year, we encourage parishioners to support the Harvest Appeal with the proceeds going towards the general running costs of the cathedral. In light of the above work the Select Vestry have decided that this year, the proceeds of the Harvest Appeal will go towards the rewiring and upgrading of lighting in the cathedral. Please do support this as generously as you can.


Teddy Bear's Picnic




