More than Conquerors

Ever since the fall in the Garden of Eden, experience has been one brokenness and enmity. For evidence of this look no further than the lives of Cain. and Abel, where one brother, so fuelled with jealously and hatred, raised his hand in anger and took the life of his own brother. In a metaphorical and literal sense we have been doing just that for each generation ever since, with the 20th Century being the bloodiest in terms of death through the consequences of conflict, either directly or indirectly. The loss of life is too horrible to contemplate with around 10 million military personnel and the same number of civilians dying in the First World War. Those terrible statistics were overshadowed in the Second World War when around 75 million lives were lost, the majority of which were civilians.

In our own context, over 30 years of violence, euphemistically referred to as "The Troubles", over 3500 lives were lost, something which remains a huge source of pain for so many. And as we heard very recently from Bishop Moses in Maridi Diocese, S Sudan, over 3 million people have lost their lives in conflict stretching back over 70 years with countless others left dealing with the consequential trauma.

As I reflect on this catalogue of loss and bloodshed throughout human history,

I am increasingly convinced that there are no winners and no losers. Don't misunderstand what I mean when I say this. Of course history will record which nations/armies won the various battles and ultimately the war. But in all of this, everyone is left with a deep sense of pain and loss, wrestling with the trauma of having lost loved ones in the pursuit of peace.

That is why it is crucial for us to remember. To remember those who are no longer with us due to conflict or war. To remember those who were intent on striving for peace and paid the ultimate sacrifice through the laying down of their lives. To remember the men, women and children, all over the world, who were the victims of cruel violence which they ultimately were not the architects of.

But we also need to remember that as we face the future with painful memories and very real trauma, that we do so with God by our side. Paul, in his letter to the Romans, states very confidently that "If God is for us, who can be against us?" Romans 8: 31b Paul is very aware of the reality of the fall in each of our lives. He lists some of the consequences in verse 35 when he asks a rhetorical question: "Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword?" All of these challenges in life are very real, to some extent or other, for Christians throughout the world today. Paul was convinced, and so should we be, that "in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us."

Ask yourself what it is that you are battling with at present. And then tell yourself what Paul told the Christians in Rome, "For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus." Romans 8: 38-39

Jesus is with you whatever it is you are facing today. To be more than conquerors means that we face the trials of life with the certainty that we are not alone. Now that is worth remembering.

I look forward to joining with you all as we remember the fallen at the cenotaph this Remembrance Day at 10.45am.




code below. All we would ask is if you're using the space to let Jill know when you enter the hall and when you leave in order that we know who is in the building in the unlikely event of an emergency.



Wider Act of Remembrance – Sunday 9th November at 6pm

Remembrance Sunday can be a particularly difficult day for many of us as we call to mind those loved ones who are no longer with us. As has been our custom in more recent years, as a Church, we are providing a space for us to remember those who have passed on since last year, or indeed beyond, through our wider act of remembrance on the evening of Remembrance Sunday at 6pm in the Cathedral.

The service will consist of 2 hymns, a bible reading, a talk, prayers and a symbolic act of remembrance using a white rose. No one will feel obliged to participate, but our experience has been that a real measure of healing can come for those who do, as together we press a little further into God's grace.

Light refreshments will be served immediately following the service.




